
The Joint Intelligence Group (JIG) conducts operations to collect, analyze and disseminate intelligence in support of force protection and the War on Terror.

Interrogations, conducted in strict compliance with Army Field Manual 2-22.3

- ALL interrogations are voluntary
- Approximately 1/3 of all interrogations are requested by the detainee

Interrogations for the majority of detainees limited to:

- Specific source-directed requirements from Combatant Commanders
- Safety of camp personnel and detainees
- Support to ongoing Office for the Administrative Review of the Detention of Enemy Combatants (OARDEC) procedures
- Support to organizations such as the Criminal Investigation Task Force (CITF) and Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI)



Intelligence support to legal:

- JIG intelligence analysts provide support to the Military Commissions and to the Habeas Corpus proceedings in U.S. Federal Court

The military Code of Conduct is the legal guide for the behavior of military members who are captured by hostile forces. While U.S. service members look to the Code of Conduct for guidance when captured, al-Qaida terrorists follow the manual referred to as the Manchester Document when captured

Information obtained by the JTF has led to:

- Information of value to the U.S. and our allies on terrorist recruitment, training, financing, planning and command and control.
- Information that specifically supports U.S. combatant commanders in the field.
- Specific support to U.S. allies.
- Information of value to the U.S. and international law enforcement agencies.
