Hurricane Information

In the event of a hurricane, your chain of command will issue directives based on the applicable Condition of Readiness. The following agencies can give you information on where to go, what to do, how to be safe, and what supplies you need during a hurricane:

Use the list below as a guideline to assemble a personal hurricane kit. If you live in hurricane-resistant housing, you will want this kit in your home. If you do not live in hurricane-resistant housing, you'll need to take this kit to your assigned shelter:

- Three-day supply of nonperishable food
- Three-day supply of water
- Disposable eating utensils
- Manual can opener
- Cooler
- Blanket
- Flashlight
- Alarm clock
- First aid kit
- Toiletries
- Prescription medicine
- Books, cards, games

Do not take valuables, alcohol, electronic devices, or cooking utensils.

Lodging

Quarters (E-1 – E-7)

The quarters for the Enlisted, NCO, and Petty Officer Ranks vary depending on the command and availability at the time of arrival. Troopers will have a twin bed; issued linens include: 1 pillow case, 1 pillow, 1 fitted sheet, 1 bed sheet, a mattress pad and blanket. Troopers may bring their own sheets/pillows if desired. In addition, troopers may purchase any of these items at the Navy Exchange (NEX).

Camp America: This area consists of a single room that can be occupied by up to six personnel. Depending on the housing density each trooper will have a twin bed and either one or two wall lockers. Each room has a half bath (toilet and sink), a TV, microwave, refrigerator and phone. The camp has four common shower rooms. Laundry facility is on the premises.

CUZCO Barracks (CB): This area consists of modular buildings. Each building has two rooms (10' x 11') with a common bath in the middle. Your room will have a twin bed, wardrobe, armoire, TV, microwave, small refrigerator, and phone. Laundry facilities are available.

Tierra Kay (TK): This area is a townhouse complex. The housing formula is simple – the number of bedrooms x 2 equals the number of occupants. Troopers will have a twin bed and a wall locker and/or armoire. Troopers share the common living areas, which include: living room, kitchen, laundry, and at least one and a half baths. The townhouse will have a TV, microwave, refrigerator, stove, phone and furniture.

Bay Hill: This area consists of modular buildings with two bedrooms with a twin bed and wall locker. Troopers share the common living areas, which include: living room, galley style kitchen, laundry, and a full bath. Each unit will have a TV, microwave, small refrigerator, stove, phone, and furniture.

Quarters (E-8 and Above)

Windward Loop: Living quarters range from 2 or 4 bedroom houses, which contains a dresser, nightstand and a full size bed. Issued linens include: 1 pillow case, 1 pillow, 1 fitted sheet, 1 bed sheet, a mattress pad and blanket. Troopers can bring their own linens/pillows. In addition, troopers may purchase any of these items at the NEX. The number of bathrooms varies per house, but plan on sharing. Troopers share the common living areas, which include: living room, kitchen, and laundry. Each house will have a TV, microwave, refrigerator, stove, phone, and dish washer.

NOTE: In all JTF-GTMO housing areas, only the main shared living area is required to be supplied with a TV. When available, JTF will supply houses with kitchen facilities with some amenities. However, troopers should not rely solely on JTF supplied items. Troopers can purchase their own, or additional items at the NEX. In addition, daily upkeep/cleanliness of personal living spaces and shared common/living areas is the responsibility of the troopers assigned.

Troopers can purchase cleaning supplies from the NEX. Scheduled and unscheduled housing/room inspections are conducted to ensure troopers health, welfare, and safety.

Military Pay & Defense Travel System

Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH). The rates vary according to categories such as your grade, marital status, Family Member status and home of residence.

Basic Allowance for Subsistence (BAS). All officers and enlisted personnel receive the standard BAS (Officers \$239.96/Enlisted \$348.44 monthly). For troopers who are dorm residents (AD) at their home station meal deductions will stop for the duration of the mobilization and will be re-instated upon return to their home station

Family Separation Allowance. \$250 a month for members whose orders separate them from their dependents, or a military spouse. Length of deployment has to be over 30 days and the amount is prorated. Members must complete a DD1561 to start, stop or report Family Separation Allowance upon return from deployment. This entitlement will be started by the home station.

Accrued Leave. While deployed troopers will earn 2.5 days of leave a month. All members assigned to JTF will adhere to the Command's Leave Policy dated 20 Oct 2011.

Imminent Danger Pay (IDP). Payable at a monthly rate of \$225. IDP will be prorated. This entitlement is started by the Joint Personnel Center (JPC) upon a trooper's arrival and stopped upon the trooper's departure. It takes approximately 60 days for IDP to show up on a Trooper's LES.

Hardship Duty Pay (HDP). Payable at a monthly rate of \$100 or \$3.33 daily. This entitlement is started by the Joint Personnel Center (JPC) upon a trooper's arrival and stopped upon a trooper's departure. It takes approximately 60 days for it to show up on a trooper's LES.

For service members assigned to JTF-GTMO, IDP/HDP-L is "limited to service members performing duties within the Joint Task Force Guantanamo Bay Detention Facilities," further defined as the JTF complex from Roosevelt Gate to Houston Gate and Camp Justice while military commission hearings are in session. (Question regarding IDP/HDP-L can be directed to the Joint Personnel Center at extension 8725.

Per Diem. Per Diem rate for all military personnel assigned to GTMO is \$3.50 daily.

GTMO is not considered a combat zone tax exclusion area; therefore, no trooper will be entitled to tax exclusions while assigned to GTMO.

Defense Travel System (DTS)

JTF-GTMO personnel use DTS to prepare temporary duty travel orders and to file related travel reimbursement vouchers. Ask your unit leadership for DTS focal points if required to travel for temporary duty.

Rotator Flight Information

The J4 Passenger Travel Office is the central point for official and unofficial travel for JTF personnel currently stationed at GTMO. For those that are planning on taking leave and traveling off the island please ensure that the following steps have been accomplished for smooth travels to and from Guantanamo Bay. First step is to complete your leave paperwork. If you plan on traveling on the rotator please stop by the J-4 Passenger Travel Office located in Bldg 906. Our travel manager will need a copy of your completed leave paperwork to reserve you a seat. For military personnel the price for a one way ticket to Jacksonville is \$240 and to Norfolk is \$344. Return flights will cost the same.

Another means of traveling to the states on leave is Space Available (Space-A). This benefit allows you to travel at a minimal cost, but only if there are seats that have not been reserved on the flight. To sign up for Space Available travel contact the Air Mobility Command (AMC) Terminal. Unfortunately AMC regulations only allow the service member to sign up for the Space Available roster on your leave check out date. Lastly, keep in mind that it is also against AMC regulations (AMCI 24-101) to reserve a seat on the rotator and cancel your reservation within the 24 hour period prior to the flight and then sign up for space available seating.

Below is additional information for the Rotator:

AMC Rotator

- Arrives at GTMO Saturday & every other Tuesday
- 2 checked bags not to exceed 70 lbs each + carry on
- \$240 one way to Jacksonville Naval Air Station, Jacksonville Florida
- \$344 one way to Norfolk Naval Air Station, Norfolk Virginia

NOTE: Many of the military, including JTF, civilians and dependents visit the Jacksonville International Airport USO Welcome Center when traveling to and from Guantanamo Bay, Cuba via NAS JAX on the rotator flights.

Effective 1 May 2011, Jacksonville International Airport USO Welcome Center will no longer be open 24/7, but rather 0700 to 2300.

Transportation

Transportation options are limited at Guantanamo Bay. Very few individuals have rental cars in the JTF. Shuttle buses are available seven days a week from 5 AM to 1 AM daily. “GTMO specials” or used cars are advertised for sale in the NAVSTA Gazette or you can find cars for sale in the NEX used car lot. A Military Exchange Car Sales office is located in the NEX atrium. Not all JTF personnel (depends on length of deployment) are eligible to purchase vehicles on GTMO through NEX Car Sales. Personnel with 180 days or longer deployments are eligible for NEX new car purchases to be delivered in-CONUS following deployment. See NEX Car Sales for more info.

The Naval Station is separated by Guantanamo Bay. A ferry and utility boat provide transportation to and from the Leeward and Windward sides of the base. Ferry schedules are posted in JTF paper “The Wire” and at the ferry landings on both sides of the base and appear on the “Roller” cable channel 4.
