

COLONEL WILLIAM A. "ANDY" RODGERS

Deputy Commander, Joint Task Force Guantanamo



Colonel Andy Rodgers is a native of Texas, former enlisted Military Police Soldier (1992-95) and a 1998 graduate of McNeese State University, receiving a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice and ROTC commission as a Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Army Military Police Corps. In 2001, Andy received a Master of Arts in Business and Organizational Security Management from Webster University. In 2019, Colonel Rodgers was a Distinguished Graduate of the Eisenhower School, receiving a Master of Science in National Security and Resource Strategy.

Colonel Rodgers's assignments include leadership from platoon leader through battalion commander and a variety of staff and instructional positions. He served as a Joint Strategic Planner and Branch Chief, Office of Irregular Warfare, J7, the Joint Staff, Washington, D.C. Currently, Colonel Rodgers is the Commander, Joint Detention Group, and Deputy Commander, Joint Task Force – Guantanamo, Naval Station Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.
